Director Bell Williams disclosed that she is the Housing Director for Eagle County and works with the Eagle County Housing and Development Authority Advisory Committee. Director Dreyer disclosed that he is a board member and secretary of Bachelor Springs Homeowners' Association.

1	PUBLIC COMMENT		
2	Public comment was called for and there was none.		
3	PFAS Class Action Settlements		
4	Mr. Zachman discussed the limited data regarding per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) in the		
5	District and Authority service areas. He reminded the boards that no treatment facility has ever detected		
6	PFAS levels at or above the EPA Proposed Maximum Contaminant Levels. He also said sampling data		
7	and other information regarding PFAS is publicly available on the ERWSD website. Discussion ensued		
8	regarding the unknown potential impacts of PFAS on water and wastewater operations and the		
9	associated treatment costs, which will be incomparably greater than the potential compensation provided		
10	in these proposed settlements. Mr. Bushong then presented a memorandum, a copy of which is attached		
11	hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by this reference. He reminded the boards that the District		
12	and Authority, as operators of a Public Water System, are Class Members of the proposed settlements.		
13	He also said that despite the lack of clear information, each board should decide whether to stay in the		
14	Class or be excluded from the 3M and Dupont settlements today in order to meet the first exclusion		
15	deadline. Further discussion ensued regarding the potential implications of staying in or opting out of		
16	these settlements. Board members unanimously agreed that it was important that both boards make a		
17	unified decision. There was further consensus that the guaranteed compensation was too insubstantial to		
18	forfeit future legal rights under the vague terms of the settlement agreements. Upon motions duly made		
19	and seconded, it was unanimously		
20	RESOLVED by the Upper Eagle Regional Water Authority Board of Directors to direct		
21	Bushong & Holleman, PC, to take such actions as necessary for the Authority to opt out of		
22	the PFAS class action settlements with 3M and DuPont; and it was unanimously		
23	RESOLVED by the Eagle River Water & Sanitation District Board of Directors to direct		
24	Bushong & Holleman, PC, to take such actions as necessary for the District to opt out of		
25	the PFAS class action settlements with 3M and DuPont.
